Booster Seat Saturdays

Is your child riding in a seatbelt too early?

The American Academy of Pediatrics says that children who have outgrown the forward facing limit for their car seat should use a belt-positioning booster until the vehicle lap and shoulder belt fits properly, typically when they have reached 4'9" in height and are between 8 and 12 years of age.
